

Wythenshawe's Forum

During the last thirty years or so hundreds of Cheshire's agricultural acres have been "developed" into a "satellite" community which now provides homes for those 100,000 people who have been "overspilled" from the parental planet of Manchester. Hitherto, the Wythenshawe community has had few cultural and recreational amenities, but in the recently opened Forum the City Council has provided facilities for a variety of leisure activities: there are two multi-purpose halls, one very large (144 ft. by 72 ft.) and one more intimate (60 ft. by 36 ft.) both with flat floors; two swimming pools, a sports hall, a lending library, a restaurant, three bars, a promenade, a small lounge andPercy Corry

most notable from our point of view—a theatre. There is a car park large enough to accommodate over 1,200 cars.

The composite structure is rather disconcertingly anonymous and there has been a curious reluctance to exhibit informative signs. With dogged persistence one may find a main entrance, not easily distinguished from the rest of the glass in the 100 yards of frontage. There are no wall or window displays of posters, play-bills or photographs: no illuminated signs save for the simple lofty announcement of "Forum": no illuminated canopy or other attempt to create a magnetic attraction, a welcoming gaiety. This main entrance fronts a vast area of something like 3,500 square yards,
