would not have been switched on. I don't like digital clocks. Whereas a glance at the hands on a dial tells you not only the time now but reminds you of its relation to time past and time future, any digital display demands mental arithmetic and not all of us are good at that. I also prefer my display to be at or in the controls and above all I like a pattern to recognise. The rows of pilots along the top of a Compact or a Duet furnish a lovely visual reminder when using a memory: this is the big chorus of all those spots or here is the one with only two spots and one circuit on the backcloth.



We came to accept it as sensible in their usuage and maybe I would have become reconciled to the VDU in time. High performance profiles

The past months have seen the arrival of two new 650 w Halogen profile spots, the 823 and 813, the former has a 150 mm diameter prismatic lens giving a four shutter shapeable wide angle beam. The 813 has two independent plano convex lenses of 150 mm and 89 mm diameter. The lens mechanism is particularly smooth with half peak angle variable from 13° to 23° with a four shutter gate. Both these spot lights can perform with a 650 w lamp far in excess of earlier 1,000 w profiles.
