


Not that A-Z (which was more a crowd-scene than a production, more a party than a play, and whose author apologised or boasted that it had only taken four days to write) might not prove commercially viable. It had the sort of rough energy and panache that so often tricks an audience into thinking that a statement has been made — an illusion worked by successes as dissimilar as Zigger Zagger, O Calcutta, and Carol Channing in Hello Dolly. But, despite Edward Bond's approval, its sprawling theme of 'Us now . . . Our







Jane Gibbings and Graham Frost who together with Eric Graham were the Directors of the Festival.




Two of the five productions from the Goldsmith's College Drama Society, Private Lives by Noel Coward and Stevie by Hugh Whitmore.
